## Uniform and Appearance Policy

### Uniform List for Year 7 to 11

All students at Llanwern High School must wear uniform to and from school, in school and on all educational visits during the school day, unless otherwise stated.

<b>Blazer</b>	Plain black with school logo.
<b>Shirt / blouse</b>	Plain white with a traditional collar and top button shirt that should be tucked in at all times.
<b>V-neck jumper</b>	Black V-neck jumpers with the school logo are permitted to be worn along with the compulsory blazer. Blazer are compulsory, <b>jumpers are optional</b> .
<b>Tie</b>	Black and silver stripes
<b>Trousers</b>	Trousers should be of formal appearance, plain black with no decoration. Leggings/tracksuit bottoms or jeans are not to be worn to school.
<b>Skirts</b>	Plain black, straight, knee length.
<b>Shoes</b>	Plain black, fully enclosed (with a back and a toe to the shoe), no decoration, weatherproof and robust and suitable for school. No boots allowed.
<b>Coats</b>	Should be waterproof and not have large logos (no hoodies permitted)
<b>Bag</b>	Big enough for books and equipment.
<b>PE</b>	School PE t-shirt with black shorts/ tracksuit bottoms/sports leggings, black socks and non markable trainers.

### Uniform List for Year 12 & 13

Black blazer without a logo

Black skirt / Black trousers

White shirt

School tie

Black shoes

We reserve the right to ban items of clothing, shoes or hairstyles which are either a Health or Safety risk or which are not consistent with our approach to uniform and appearance.

### Appearance code

The uniform of the students at Llanwern High School is very important and will be closely monitored. There are, however, elements of the uniform that go beyond what is worn to "**how**" the uniform is worn.

- Top coats should be conventional, front opening garments, weather proof and not have large logos. No hoodies, tracksuit tops, denim, leather or similar style jackets that have studs, unnecessary zips, logos/pictures or buckle).
- Belts should be plain, small buckled and not worn as a fashion accessory
- Socks and tights must not be coloured or patterned
- Shoes must be completely black and low heeled. Boots and sandals may not be worn
- Hairstyles should be moderate and of a natural appearance. No hair decoration is permitted (including jojo bows)
- Jewellery allowed - one small plain stud earring in each earlobe and a wrist watch. (Spacers, Tunnels and Plugs are not permitted on Health & Safety grounds)
- Piercings - The school only permits one small stud per earlobe - no other piercings are permitted. Students **will** be asked to remove extra studs and the fact that the piercing is in the process of "healing" will not be an acceptable reason to keep the piercing in. The timing of such a piercing should therefore be considered very carefully by students and parents

- Make-up – should be discreet.
- Nails should be short (no nail varnish). No false nails are permitted.
- Any tattoo on a child under 18 years old has been performed illegally under the Tattooing of Minors Act 1969. Tattoos which are visible when wearing normal school uniform are not allowed i.e. on face, neck, hands or arms
